Course Description

This course is designed to introduce students to the interrelationship between business and the natural environment; specifically, it examines the impact of the environment on business and the consequences of daily and long-term business decisions on the environment. This is a hands-on course in which you will be required to do much reflection on how you can impact the decision-making at your organization regardless of your position. You will also customize a final project.

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

- Apply contemporary and emerging economic and environmental knowledge to an organization's strategy.
- Innovate sustainable strategies to help an organization compete locally and/or globally.
- Recommend ways organizations can improve their environmental sustainability efforts.

Investment Assignment and Final Project

Investment Assignment

There are two key articles you will use as a basis for applying socially responsible investment strategies (SRI). The goal is to reflect on insights you will gain from these articles that you can apply to your firm, and that you might choose to incorporate in your Final Project. That is, the authors showed various ways for meeting the demand of private institutional investors for combining ethical concerns and financial decisions. How might you inform your firm to guide portfolio investments, respond to shareholder activism, or community development investing? If, for example, you were to find that investments in SRI provide the same return as conventional investments what rationale can you support in persuading your firm to seek socially responsible actions?

Final Project

The purpose of the final project is to allow you to incorporate the many facets of sustainability from this course into a coherent, meaningful actionable plan that you *could* submit to an appropriate level of management for consideration at your firm (whether you do or not is, of course, up to you). Importantly, the medium in which you choose is up to you (e.g., PowerPoint, video, mixed media presentation), and allows you to create the most appropriate and relevant presentation given your position and firm's strategies and tactics vis-a`-vis Sustainability and organizational management.

Grades

Grades will be assessed using a variety of methods. As with any course, your level of participation on a regular basis is critical to your successful understanding and completion of the course. Scoring is as follows:

- Discussions: 65%
- Assignments: 35%

The discussions each week, in addition to the regular reading material, are important and play an ongoing part in deepening our understanding of sustainability and its interaction with business strategy and operations.

An important caveat to keep in mind. You start the course and each and every portion thereof with a zero and earn points onward and upward. Thus, it is inappropriate to assume that on any given graded aspect of the course that points would have been taken away. For instance, let's say you submit a paper and earn a 46/50 and then inquire: "Can you tell me why you took away four points?" You never have any points to take away from. A much better inquiry would be: "I earned 46 of the available 50 points, can you tell me what you are looking for to ensure that I maximize my scores on future assignments/discussions/etc." A mindset that one starts with a perfect score and can only lose points, while common, only serves to keep a focus on points and not on the learning objectives nor critical course material.







Accommodation for Students with Disabilities
